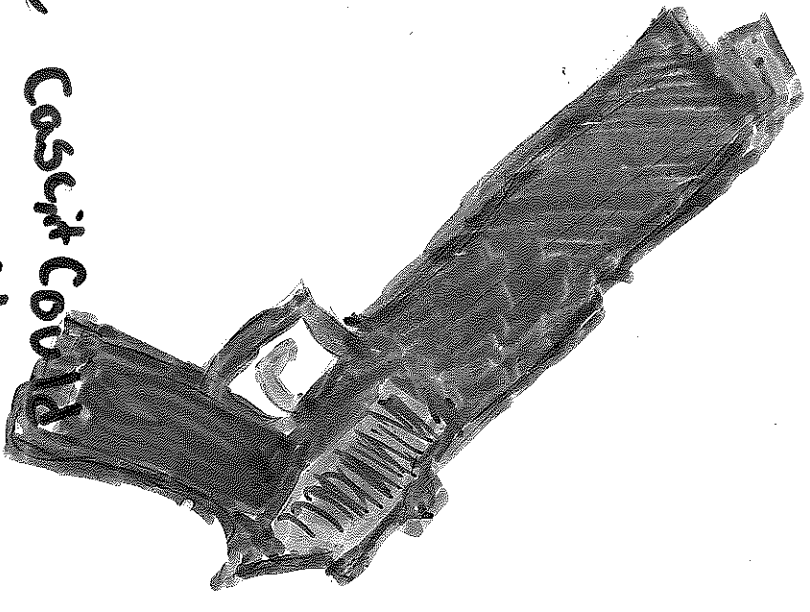


Michael Brown Shooting

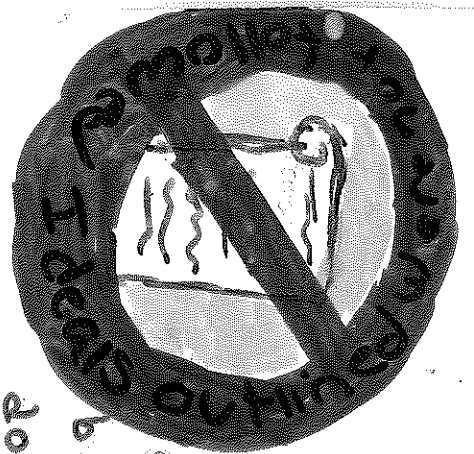

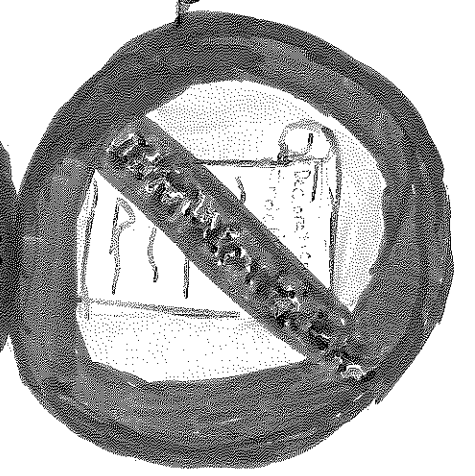


Slavery contradicts constitutional ideals
